HAW 101 : Elementary Hawaiian I
(ONLINE/Synchronous) CREDITS: 4

Dates: 6/7- 7/16, M-F

Time: 3:00- 5:00pm

An elementary course in the Hawaiian language which focuses on rules of grammar, pattern drills, the building of an adequate vocabulary to facilitate conversation, and reading of selected materials at an elementary level.

HWST 296: Kūkulu Hale and Kuapā:
Building Traditional Hawaiian Structures
(IN-PERSON) CREDITS: 3

Dates: 6/7 - 6/18, M-F

Time: 9:00am - 2:00pm

In this class students will learn of the techniques and protocols used in the construction of traditional Hawaiian structures. The class will learn about the Hawaiian Hale (House) and the Kuapā (Fishpond wall). Dry Stack Rock Masonry. Students will learn the history and methods of building through lecture and through the construction of an actual hale and a fishpond wall.
